Learning this September!

As a brief outline, these are some of the areas of learning that your children will be developing this Autumn half term:

Nursery - Our youngest children in school will be learning 'All About Me!', finding out what is unique and special about them and how to be a good friend. They will be reading Elma and painting their own portraits and Elma's! In later weeks, we will be reading "The Gingerbread Man" and creating all sorts of special creations linked to gingerbread.

Reception - We will be learning all about ourselves, and reading 'The Colour Monster', learning about different emotions. We will start our phonics to begin our reading journeys, listening to the Gingerbread Man and learning about shapes and colours in Maths! Our new areas and equipment outside will also be explored to bring our learning from indoors to outdoors - exciting!

Y1/2 - In Art, we will be exploring Picasso and his abstract art to recreate our own abstract portrait. In History, we will be thinking about our Grandparents and what life was like for them when they were our age. We will be investigating materials in Science and reading 'Lost and Found' in English to create our own adventure story!

Y3/4 - It's all about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings in History this half term, where we will learn about their adventures and raids. We will read 'Gorilla' by Anthony Browne in English and write our own fiction tales - and we even have a special author coming to visit us too...! In Science, we will be investigating electricity and creating our own circuits, whilst in Art, we will be learning about Giorgio Morandi and creating our still life drawings.

Y5 - We are exploring a place far away from Rossington - North Americal In Geography, we will be finding out its physical and human features as well as special landmarks, and in Art we will be developing architectural drawings linked to New York City. In RE, we will be exploring the importance of God, asking the question "Who is God?" and developing our understanding of our and other's spiritual answers. In Science, we will investigate forces whilst in Enlgish we are reading 'Queen of the Falls', linked to Niagara Falls.

Y6 - We are starting the year by reading 'Save the Tiger' during our English lessons, leading to us writing informative, persuasive texts about endangered animals and for a class read, our book is 'When the sky falls'. In Science, we are broadening our knowledge of and classifying living things and habitats. We're heading back to 1939 in History, back to World War 2, learning about the significant events and what life was like. In Art, we will be discovering about typography and drawing our own creations, whilst in RE, it's all about 'Believing, Behaving and Belonging'



Parent and Family Events

We have planned, throughout the year, events which bring parents into school more, both linked to learning and as a community. There are workshops, coffee mornings, open mornings, quiz nights and bingo nights planned - take a look at the yearly calendar for dates. We love the engagement we get from parents and always welcome parental involvement.

This half term, we have our Welcome Meetings 18-22nd September, Macmillan Coffee Morning on the 29th September, a Family Quiz and Hot Dog night on the 11th October.

We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible!
